



ome mission dioceses across the country face similar challenges: small Catholic populations, great distances between parishes, and economic hardships that make it difficult for parishes to meet the pastoral needs of their communities. In northern Alabama's Diocese of Birmingham, for instance, one parish is the only Catholic church in its county. Another parish affected by high unemployment and underemployment lacks resources to pay for youth ministry and parish activities. Despite these economic challenges, the diocese is committed to forming disciples in the parishes and providing quality education to poor and minority students.

Support from Catholic Home Missions makes the day-to-day ministries of these parishes possible through grants to the diocese for parish operations, training of parish catechetical leaders, youth ministry support, and one-on-one attention to help struggling Catholic school pupils succeed in their education. When you support the Catholic Home Missions Appeal, your contribution helps dioceses like Birmingham keep their parishes open and available to meet the pastoral needs of their communities.

# What Is a Home Mission Diocese?

Home mission dioceses are those Catholic dioceses in the United States, its territories, and former territories that cannot provide basic pastoral services without outside help. Basic pastoral services include Mass, the sacraments, religious education, and ministry training for priests, deacons, religious sisters, and laypeople. Nearly 40% of dioceses in the United States and its territories are considered home missions.



# **FORTALECIENDO** LA IGLESIA



as diócesis misioneras en nuestro país enfrentan desafíos similares: poblaciones con un pequeño número de católicos, grandes distancias entre parroquias y dificultades económicas que no les permiten a estas diócesis responder a las necesidades pastorales de sus respectivas comunidades. Por ejemplo, en la zona norte de Alabama, en la Diócesis de Birmingham, una parroquia es la única iglesia católica en el condado. Otra parroquia, afectada por mucho desempleo y subempleo, carece de recursos para pagar la pastoral juvenil y las actividades parroquiales. A pesar de estos desafíos económicos, la diócesis se ha comprometido a formar discípulos en las parroquias y proporcionar una educación de calidad a los estudiantes pobres y los de minorías.

El apoyo de las Misiones Católicas hace posible que estas parroquias puedan


enfrentar los ministerios cotidianos mediante subvenciones a la diócesis para el funcionamiento de la parroquia, la capacitación de líderes catequéticos de la parroquia, apoyo a la pastoral juvenil y, para que puedan obtener una educación exitosa, una atención personalizada a aquellos alumnos de la escuela católica que luchan por salir adelante. #### ¿Qué es una Diócesis Misionera?

Las diócesis misioneras son aquellas diócesis en los Estados Unidos, sus territorios y antiguos territorios, que no pueden proporcionar los servicios pastorales básicos sin recibir una ayuda externa. Los servicios pastorales básicos incluyen la Misa, los sacramentos, la educación religiosa y la capacitación en el ministerio para sacerdotes, diáconos, religiosas y personas laicas. Casi el 40% de las diócesis en los Estados Unidos y sus territorios, es considerado territorio de diócesis misioneras.


