In the middle of the Gospel of Matthew - chapter 13 - Jesus tells 7 parables: stories used by Jewish rabbis (teachers) to instruct their followers. All 7 parables are about the kingdom of heaven. Coming right in the middle of Matthew's Gospel, it's clear that the kingdom of heaven is the theme of Matthew's story of Jesus.

What is the kingdom of heaven? First, it's another name for the kingdom of God - pious Jews did not pronounce the name of god. The "kingdom of God" is God's rule of justice, peace and abundance over the universe and all it contains. At this time, we see God's kingdom in glimpses, here and there. When Jesus Christ returns to transition the current creation into the restored and perfect creation, the kingdom of God will be completely revealed to us, because it will be all there is. This is what we're praying for every time we pray the Lord's Prayer: "thy kingdom come!"

Over the span of last Sunday, today, and next Sunday we hear all 7 of these parables of the kingdom of heaven at Mass. Last week - the different kinds of soil where the kingdom tries to grow . This week - the weed and the wheat growing together, the mustard seed, and the yeast in a loaf of bread. Next Sunday - the treasure hidden in a field, the

finest pearl in the world, and the net thrown by a commercial fisherman into the sea that catches both worthwhile and worthless fish. The point of last Sunday's parable was to be in the kingdom requires discipleship (following Jesus) along with conversion. The points of this Sunday's parables are - who is in the kingdom will only be known at the very end (weeds and wheat); the kingdom is hidden now in the world in the lives of believers, but one day all will see it (the mustard seed); Jesus' kingdom is
