


St. Mary Works of Mercy Drive


Everything we have is a gift from God and we're called to share these gifts with others. This is stewardship.



Listen and meditate to it until Christmas.	30 St. Andrew the Apostle St. Andrew answered Jesus' call and led others to Him. Pray for those discerning the priesthood or religious life.
