



Dear brothers and sisters, if we follow the "Good Shepherd" - no matter how difficult, tortuous or long the pathways of our life may seem, even through spiritual deserts without water and under the scorching sun of rationalism - with the guidance of Christ the Good Shepherd, we too, like the Psalmist, may be sure that we are walking on "paths of righteousness" and that the Lord is leading us, is ever close to us and that we "shall lack nothing". For this reason the Psalmist can declare his calm assurance without doubt or fear: "Even though I walk through the valley of death, I fear no evil; for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff they comfort



me." Dear brothers and sisters, Psalm 23 invites us to renew our trust in God, abandoning ourselves totally in His hands. Let us therefore ask with faith that the Lord also grant us on the difficult ways of our times that we always walk on His paths as a docile and obedient flock, and that He welcome us to His house, to His table, and lead us to "still waters" so that, in accepting the gift of His Spirit, we may quench our thirst at His sources, springs of living water "welling us to eternal life" (John 4:14).





Nearly one million South Sudanese refugees now shelter in neighboring Uganda, with many located in the Bidi Bidi refugee camp in northern Uganda. For Jimmy Luate, his wife, Jackie, and their daughter, Stella, Bidi Bidi has been home since they fled the war in 2016. Catholic Relief Services—through a comprehensive program of home building, training in hygiene practices, and leadership development—



has helped Jimmy become a leading advocate for refugee families in need.

Un ejemplo de esto es el pueblo de Sudán del Sur, el cual se independizó en el 2011 cuando sus habitantes, por una abrumadora mayoría, eligieron separarse de Sudán, convirtiéndose en el más reciente y reconocido estado soberano del mundo.

Los enfrentamientos entre grupos étnicos rivales resultaron en una guerra civil que duró desde el 2013 hasta el 2020, por lo cual millones de personas huyeron a países vecinos. Cerca de un millón de refugiados de Sudán del Sur hoy se albergan en Uganda, donde muchos de ellos viven en el campamento de refugiados Bidi Bidi, al norte de Uganda. Para Jimmy Luate, su esposa Jackie y su hija Stella, Bidi Bidi es su nuevo hogar desde que huyeron de la guerra en el 2016. Catholic Relief Services, a



través de un programa integral de construcción de viviendas, capacitación en prácticas de higiene y desarrollo de liderazgo—ha avudado Jimmy a convertirse en un líder y defensor de las familias de refugiados más necesitadas.

familias de refugiados como la de Jimmy, sino que también empoderan y capacitan a futuros líderes quienes trabajan para establecer la paz y la estabilidad en sus países natales.
