Speakers:

Keynote Speaker: Dr. Marcellino D'Ambrosio, aka "Dr. Italy"



Dr. Marcellino D'Ambrosio, also known as "Dr. Italy," holds an MA and PhD in historical theology from Catholic University of America and is known for delivering profound Catholic truths in understandable and relevant terms. In addition to teaching for CDU, Dr. D'Ambrosio has been a professor at the International Catholic University, Ave Maria University, University of Dallas and Loyola College in Maryland.

Dr. D'Ambrosio is the director of <u>CrossroadsInitiative.com</u> and regularly discusses the Catholic faith on secular and Catholic TV and radio. His scholarly work has been published in the theological journal Communio. Dr. D'Ambrosio is a New York Times best-selling author for his Guide to the Passion: 100 Questions about the Passion of the Christ and an Amazon best-selling author for his book When the Church was Young: The Voice of the Early Fathers. Most recently, he has contributed to the immensely popular video Bible Studies by Ascension Press, Jesus the Way, the Truth and the Life and What We Believe: The Beauty of the Catholic Faith.

Dr. Italy will feature the following talks at Faith on Fire:

THE SACRAMENTS: GOD'S BODY LANGUAGE

Reflecting on universal experience on the importance of non-verbal communication, especially in matters of love, this talk helps the audience see the sacraments as God's body language, as seven different embraces of divine love that come to us in different critical moments of life."

THE EARLY FATHERS: WHO THEY ARE AND WHY THEY MATTER

In a single talk, Dr. Italy points out several contemporary issues and shows how these issues were already confronted in the earliest days of the Church, providing insights, answers, and inspiration for us today. Drawn from his best-selling book When the Church Way Young: Voices of the Early Fathers, this talk covers some of the most colorful characters in the history of the Church."

TEMPERANCE: THE KEY TO FREEDOM

Many think that the Catholic Church is against pleasure and passion, thinking them evil and urging us to repress and deny our passions. This talk shows that the Church has always had a quite different view on the matter. This talk shows how temperance brings balance, strength and freedom into a person's life, not eradication pleasure, but instead making it serve the life-giving purpose for which it was created rather than

becoming self-destructive. The talk touches on lots of hot topics: sexual desire, the drive to earn money, enjoy entertainment, food, alcoholic beverages, and even spiritual and intellectual pleasures like learning and prayer. Part of an 8-part series recorded on EWTN entitled "The Virtues: Seven Habits of Champions."

Guest Speaker: Mother Prioress Noella Marcellino, OSB



Mother Noella Marcellino O.S.B., a Benedictine of the Abbey of Regina Laudis in Bethlehem, CT has been Prioress at the Abbey's Foundation, Our Lady of the Rock, on Shaw Island, WA since 2020. These contemplative communities are dedicated to the praise of God through prayer, hospitality, and stewardship of the land.

Mother Noella began making the Abbey's Bethlehem cheese in 1977 and holds a Ph.D. in Microbiology, specializing in the biochemical and genetic diversity of cheese-ripening fungi. A documentary film, The Cheese Nun: Sister Noëlla's Voyage of Discovery, produced by the Paris American Television Company, documented her journey collecting and analyzing

samples from traditional cheese-making regions of France while on a Fulbright Fellowship at the French National Institute of Agricultural Research. Her work has also been featured in the 2016 Netflix documentary series Cooked, based on author Michael Pollan's book Cooked: A Natural History of Transformation. She is a contributing author to The Oxford Companion to Cheese, Oxford University Press, 2016, and to the American Society of Microbiology book Cheese and Microbes, 2014.

Mother Noella has been invited by many academic institutions and parishes to present her scientific research, and also to share her insights into the way science has informed her life as a contemplative Benedictine. Her article: Sacro Speco—St. Benedict's Cave: The Roots of Monastic Cheesemaking was published in the Fall 2017 Food issue of Communio, International Catholic Review. More recently the chapter "The Beauty of God in Cheese Making and Chant" was published in Margarita Mooney Suarez' 2022 book: The Wounds of Beauty: Seven Dialogues on Art and Education. She was honored to give a Keynote Address at the Prairie Symposium for the Common Good, 2022 Ecology and the Common Good held at St. Paul's College, University of Manitoba.

Mother Noella will feature the following talk at Faith on Fire:

Laudato Sì: Taste and See the Wonders of God's Creation

Mother Noella is an artisanal cheesemaker and holds a doctorate from the University of Connecticut in microbiology, specializing in the biodiversity of cheese-ripening fungi. She will share her insights into the way

the principles of cheesemaking and science have informed her life as a contemplative Benedictine. Drawing on the Holy Rule of St. Benedict, and the monastic tradition, she will explore how the Laws of Nature open us to the immensity of God's Creation and His love for us. She will invite you to ponder the Book of Nature at work in your lives. As St. Augustine says of creation:

Some people, in order to discover God, read books. But there is a great book: the very appearance of created things. Look above you! Look below you! Note it. Read it. God, whom you want to discover, never wrote that book with ink.



Instead He set before your eyes the things that He had made. Can you ask for a louder voice than that? Why, heaven and earth shout to you: "God made me!"

Guest Speaker: Sylvester Vijay Rozario



Sylvester Vijay Rozario, a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Seattle, is currently pursuing theological studies at Mount Angel Seminary in Oregon. Sylvester grew up in the South Indian city of Chennai where St. Thomas the Apostle was martyred. He grew up influenced by his family's Catholic faith and the Salesian priests at Don Bosco High School in Chennai. Prior to joining seminary, he had a career in research, education and healthcare, and holds master's degrees in bioengineering and philosophy.

Sylvester's experience of God moving in powerful ways in his life led to his decision to discern the priesthood. He finds great joy in giving witness to the

ways in which he experiences God at work. Besides getting together with friends, he loves watching movies, dancing, taking drives to music, being by the water, making giant bubbles and surprising people with his red nose.

Sylvester will feature the following talk at Faith on Fire:

Living Tabernacles: Embracing Your Eucharistic Identity

Imagine your life as an unfolding parable. What would your story reveal about who God is calling us to be as a Church? Drawing upon reflections on the speaker's life and experiences of God's Presence, this session will challenge us to embrace our collective identity as 'Fools for Christ'.

Mother Ozanne Schumann, O.S.B



Mother Ozanne Schumann, O.S.B. a Benedictine of the Abbey of Regina Laudis in Bethlehem, CT, relocated to Our Lady of the Rock Monastery, a foundation of Regina Laudis on Shaw Island, WA in 2024. She has a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Photography and is a licensed arborist. She has brought her skills in arboriculture and land management to Our Lady of the Rock, where she teaches younger community members and monastic interns to drive big machinery and to care for pastures and farm animals.

Mother Ozanne's poetry, inspired by her life of prayer and work, has been published in Image Journal and Small Farmer's Journal. She holds sacred the life of the land as an expression of the life of God and is passionate about sharing the gifts of our wilder, native places with others. The Youth attending

Faith on Fire will have a unique opportunity for an outdoor adventure under her guidance.

Mother Ozanne will lead an activity, "An Outdoor Adventure: Tracking a Path to God," for the Junior and Teen tracks at Faith on Fire.

Mary White, Postulant of Our Lady of the Rock Monastery O.S.B.



Mary White entered Our Lady of the Rock Monastery O.S.B. on Shaw Island WA as a postulant in June 2023. She was born in Gretna, Louisiana and is the eldest of 11 children. She was nurtured in her Catholic Faith and education at her Parish, St. Peter's in Covington. Mary received a Bachelor of Art and Master's Degree in Psychology at Southeastern Louisiana University. She worked as a Life Coach at Trinity Teen Solutions, a residential ranch for Catholic girls in Wyoming. She also worked as a Rehabilitation Therapist within the Louisiana Prison System and was the Coordinator of the Youth Catechetical Program at the Cathedral of St. John Berchmans in the Diocese of Shreveport, LA.

Mary participated in Our Lady of the Rock's Monastic Internship Program before becoming a pre-postulant in 2022. During this time Mary took care of the monastery's animals: feeding the beef herd, and milking and caring for

sheep. During her postulancy her love of the flock has intensified, especially as she helps care for the 7 lambs born this spring. She has a gift for hospitality, preparing the guest houses and welcoming guests and interns. She also enjoys sewing and weaving. Her bread and freshly-baked cookies are very much appreciated by all. Mary loves working with young children. The children participating in her art project: You Are What You Eat! are in for a treat.
