


Sacraments

Tips and Etiquette

The priest's kiss upon the altar at Mass's beginning and end honors Christ, the living stone. Rooted in early Christian reverence, it recalls the Last Supper table, then became a sacred salute in reverence to our Lord and Savior.

(Which is why it is appropriate for us to bow when we pass in front of the

altar!)

As we witness this kiss, we join in silent adoration. This practice exemplifies faith and devotion, inviting us to greet Christ with reverent hearts.


Our annual stewardship campaign has begun. Pledge cards are in the pews.

The Search Begins Testimonies

- I have experienced a better connection with the other people in my community such as my classmates from my RE class. Also, it made me see what my end goal is in this life and how to get to that salvation. I have also gotten closer to God and strengthened my prayer life and faith. This retreat was something new but I'm glad I came so I could learn and experience these great new things with the people around me.
- I feel closer to God than I was before and my faith in now bigger. I found out things I did not know before, I got to meet new people, and I found out "what is happiness" to me.
- It was fun. I love doing things like this. I felt I got closer to God ad that he speaks to me in different ways and he is actively working through me.

- It was really nice because learning the true meaning behind the church could eventually help me do better just like the astronaut who brought the Eucharist in space so they could receive communion on Sunday. That showed how important it is to anyone who believes.
- This retreat helped me with recovering from my problems and helped me memorize some prayers.
- God knew that I wanted to learn more and e more apart and he gave me a chance to come and learn more. I think he just wanted me to just really open my eyes and realize why I am here.
- I believe the retreat helped me with my faith and taught me things I didn't know when I first came here.
- What I'm taking away is God's love. I always new God loved me, but on the retreat, I realized how much he loves me. I felt his love. I know through him everything is possible, like it made me feel the love because he died for my wrongs. Just the fact that he <u>died</u> for me makes me feel the fulfillment I've been looking for. This retreat made me realize how lucky I am to be Catholic.
- This retreat changed me. I learned how to say the rosary, learned more about God, made better friendships with other people, learned how to roll a sleeping bag because Xitallia's father taught me how. Food was great.
- My experience with the retreat helped show why everything so little is so important.
 God is with you every step of the way, everything happens for a reason, and looking for answers deep down inside yourself is a way to change yourself for the better and have a cleaner path ahead of yourself.
- This retreat helped me learn more about my religion and also helped me to earn from
 my past mistakes. It made me feel a lot closer to God than I did before while having fun
 and meeting new people. I got to do things I've never done before which I'm so grateful
 for getting to try! I had a great time here and hope I can go again next year.
- This retreat really helped me see clearly Christ and His love for me. It has really given me motivation to run to him and never look back. This has affirmed the things I've been trying to do to become closer to the Lord and has also pointed out my sins and just how much God is willing to do to redeem me from them. I came here with questions about the Lord's will for my life and vocation and he's really guided me. I know from this that heaven is my ultimate goal and that no matter what I do, he (I need him to be) at the center. My heart is overflowing with fervor and zeal to do what he wants.
