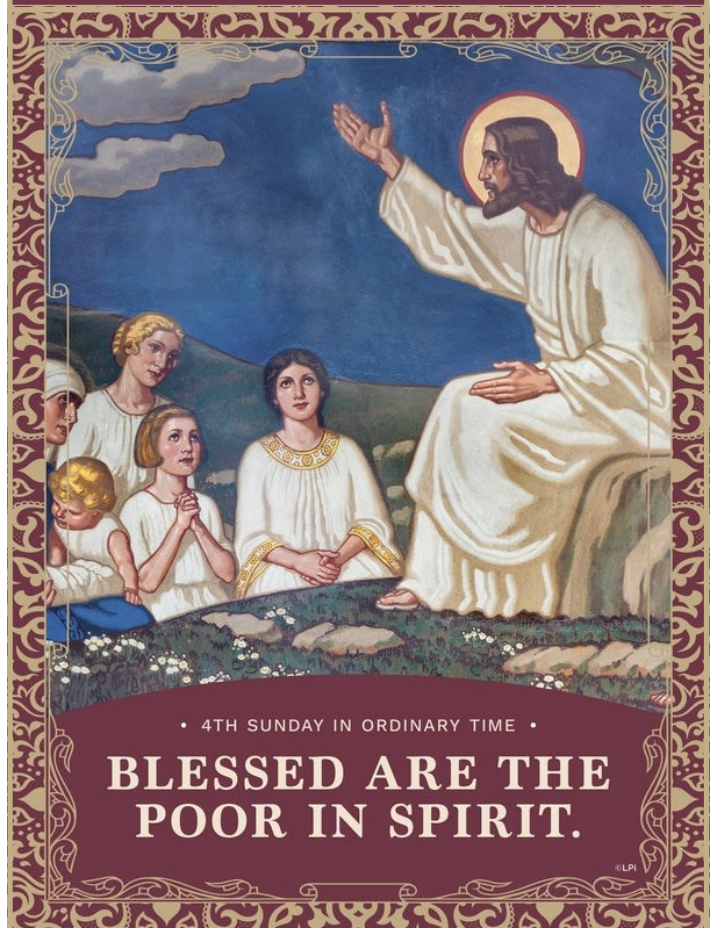

At Holy Mass, we are invited to unite our voices with the whole Church in the responses, prayers, and creeds, offering heartfelt praise to Christ our Lord who is present among us. At the same time, there are sacred moments during the Mass for silent adoration, when we quietly open our hearts to Jesus in the Eucharist and allow His peace to touch us. Our postures—standing to reverence His living Word in the Gospel, kneeling in humble adoration at the consecration—express our love, awe, and dependence on the One who gives Himself to us completely. In this beautiful balance of voice and silence, rising and kneeling, we draw nearer to Christ, truly present and waiting for us.

Prayer for Vocations

O Lord, our prophetic Shepherd, You proclaim Your mission despite rejection. Plant in our hearts a desire for vocations—priesthood, religious life, or marriage. Give us courage to speak Your truth amid opposition.

Guide us to the paths You have prepared with resilient hearts. Fill us with zeal to fulfill Your word, purity to reflect Your anointing, and humility to endure trials. May we, through steadfast witness, answer Your call, lead others to Your salvation, and find joy in serving You eternally. Amen.

"The Heart of Jesus' Preaching"

Last week, I watched a poor street musician play with such passion that passersby paused, touched by his joy amid hardship. This scene echoed today's Gospel, where Jesus teaches the Beatitudes from the mountain, blessing the poor in spirit, the meek, and those who hunger for justice (Matthew 5:3-10). The Catechism teaches, "The Beatitudes respond to the natural desire for happiness" (CCC 1718), revealing God's kingdom in unexpected places. That musician's melody felt like divine consolation.

I recall my own struggles, chasing worldly success only to find emptiness, until the Beatitudes reshaped my heart. The Catechism adds, "The Beatitudes are at the heart of Jesus' preaching" (CCC 1716), calling us to live counterculturally.

Jesus' promise of the kingdom reminded me: true blessing flows from dependence on God. That street song taught me poverty of spirit opens heaven's gates.

In our ordinary time, let us embrace the Beatitudes. May prayer and mercy shape us, transforming our lives into beacons of God's reign.
