



This morning, I watched my nephew hesitate before joining a tough soccer tryout, weighing the effort against his love for the game. This lingered as I pondered today's Gospel, where Jesus says, "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:27). The Catechism teaches, "Christ proposes the evangelical counsels, in their great variety, to every disciple" (CCC 1618), calling us to sacrifice for love. That boy's resolve mirrored my own struggle—choosing faith over ease.

I recall my early years, avoiding hard choices to fit in, only to find peace in commitment. The Catechism adds, "The

family should live in such a way that its members learn to care and take responsibility for the young" (CCC 2232), a duty extending to spiritual growth. His tryout reminded me: discipleship demands counting the cost, like building a tower or waging war (Luke 14:28, 31), yet promises eternal reward.

In our busy lives, let us embrace this cross with courage. May prayer and sacrifice shape us, guiding us to follow Christ fully, transforming our efforts into lasting joy.




