


Baptisms:



Yesterday, I watched my niece plant a tiny seed, her small hands trusting it would grow despite the odds. This moment echoed today's Gospel, where Jesus says, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted,'" and calls us to serve humbly like servants (Luke 17:6, 10). The Catechism teaches, "Faith is a gift of God, a supernatural virtue infused by him" (CCC 162), a quiet strength that transforms the impossible. Her faith in that seed stirred me.



I recall my own doubts, fearing my efforts fell short, only to find God's grace multiplies them. The Catechism adds, "Faith is the theological virtue by which we believe in God and all that he has revealed" (CCC 1814), urging us to trust beyond sight. The servant's duty reminded me: our work, though small, honors God. That seedling's promise taught me faith grows through obedience.

In our hurried world, let us nurture this faith. May prayer and humble service shape us, transforming our doubts into the mustard seed's mighty yield.


