

The sanctuary lamp (or candle), is a steady flame near the tabernacle. The candle light signifies Christ's true presence in the Eucharist. Rooted in ancient tradition, it glows as a silent witness, then invites reverence during prayer. As we pass, we bow or



genuflect, honoring its meaning. This practice exemplifies faith and devotion, urging us to approach with respectful awe.



This morning, I helped a friend find a lost scarf, her grateful smile lighting up the room. This small act echoed today's Gospel, where only one of ten healed lepers returns to thank Jesus, prompting His words, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you" (Luke 17:19).



The Catechism teaches, "Jesus' compassion for the sick and his many healings... are a sign of the kingdom of God" (CCC 1504), revealing God's mercy. That smile felt like a lesson.

I recall my own ingratitude, taking blessings for granted, only to learn thanksgiving deepens faith. The Catechism adds, "Thanksgiving characterizes the prayer of the Church" (CCC 2637), a duty the leper fulfilled. The other nine's silence once mirrored my heart, but that scarf moment shifted me—gratitude transforms us. Jesus' question, "Where are the other nine?" (Luke 17:17), lingers as a call to return.

In our busy lives, let us pause to give thanks. May prayer and gratitude shape us, turning our hearts toward God's healing love.
