

- ❖ Please contact Mary Waters at 360-215-3049 or adultff@staugustineoh.org for more information or to register for class.


Anointings:

- ❖ After 4pm Tuesday-Friday or Saturday/Sunday, call the office at 360-675-2303 and listen to the message to receive the **emergency anointing or last rites only** phone number. *On any Monday*, please call another parish to request an anointing.

Tips and Etiquette

To prepare for Sunday Mass, arrive early to quiet your heart in prayer, observe the Eucharistic fast of one hour before Communion, and seek reconciliation through the Sacrament of Confession if in grave sin. Review the day's readings to enter more deeply into the mystery of Christ's sacrifice. Dress modestly to honor the sacred assembly, and silence distractions like phones to focus on the Lord. This preparation opens the soul to divine grace, as the Church teaches, allowing the Holy Sacrifice to transform us in union with Christ.

“Fishers of Men”


Last week, I saw a fisherman mend his nets by the lake, his steady work a testament to patience and purpose. This scene echoed today's Gospel, where Jesus walks by the Sea of Galilee, calling Simon and Andrew, then James and John, to leave their nets and follow him as “fishers of men” (Matthew 4:18-22). The Catechism teaches, “Jesus calls his disciples to follow him... and to share his mission” (CCC 787), inviting ordinary lives into divine work. That fisherman's rhythm felt like God's patient pursuit.

I recall my own reluctance, clinging to familiar routines when change beckoned, only to find freedom in letting go. The Catechism adds, “Jesus' public life allows everyone to come to know him” (CCC 541), as he preaches repentance and the kingdom in Galilee. The disciples' immediate response reminded me: calls demand trust. That mending net taught me discipleship reshapes us for greater catch.

In our ordinary time, let us heed Jesus' voice. May prayer and surrender open us to his mission, transforming our labors into eternal harvest.
